DISCUSSION:

The Buffalo Erie Niagara Land Improvement Corporation (BENLIC) acquired the property of 850 Tonawanda Creek Road, Town of Amherst via Erie County In-Rem Auction in 2016 as part of its annual RFF Process. Town of Amherst representatives expressed an interest to acquire the vacant parcel and preserve it as open space with access to an existing bike path. This use is in accordance with their open space plan and the parcel will be managed according to the wishes of the NYS Canal Corporation. Amherst has offered \$300.00 for the parcel. This is the total assessed value at the time BENLIC acquired the property.

BENLIC staff has reviewed the Town of Amherst offer, and letter of intent from the Amherst Town Supervisor. The purpose of the proposed disposition is congruent with BENLIC's mission to return property to productive use.



Pursuant to the Property Disposition Guidelines of BENLIC, section 4.2(A), the Corporation may dispose of real property by negotiation.
